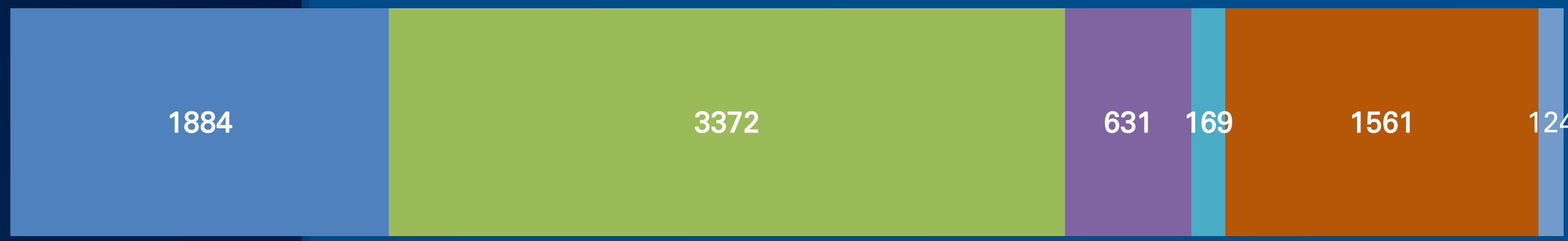

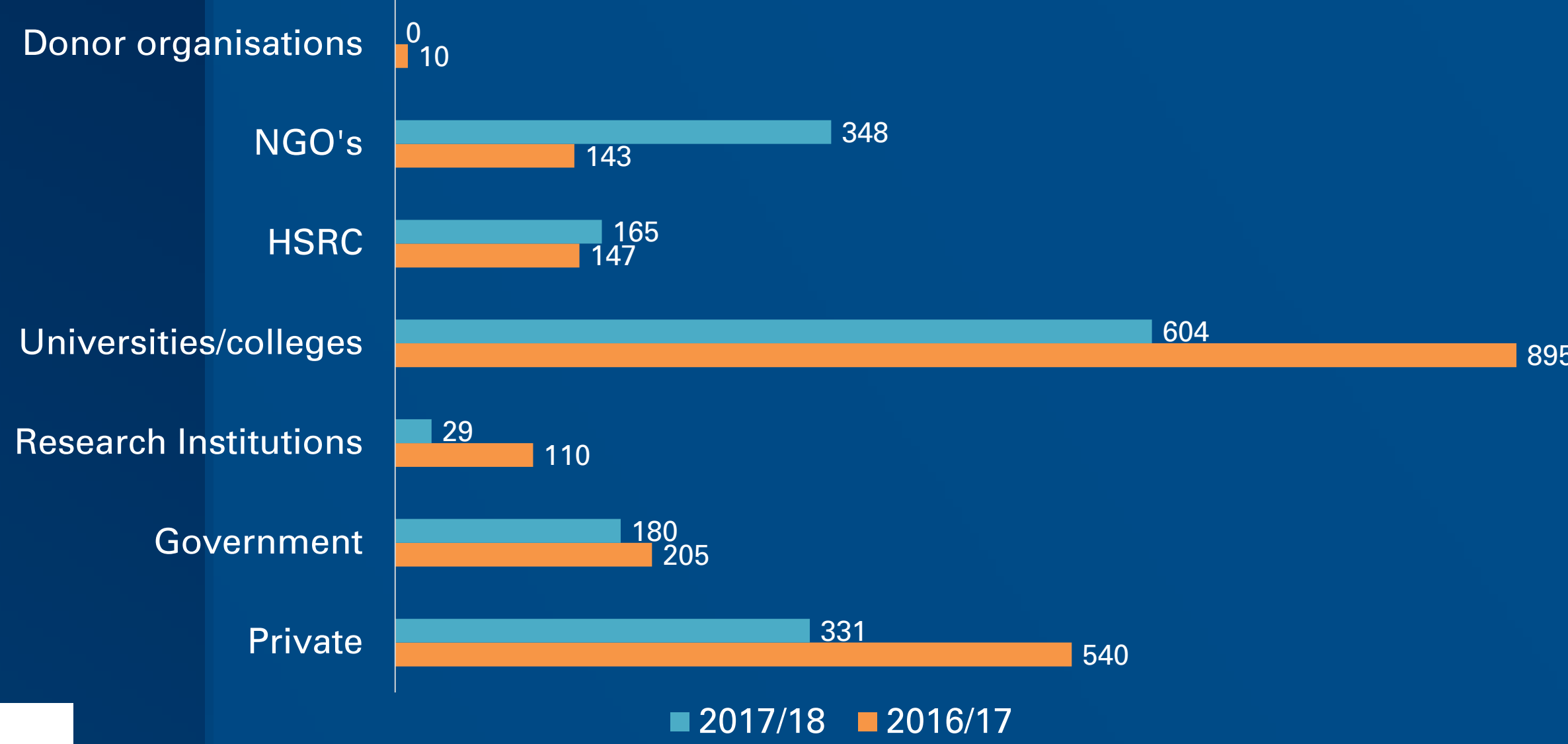

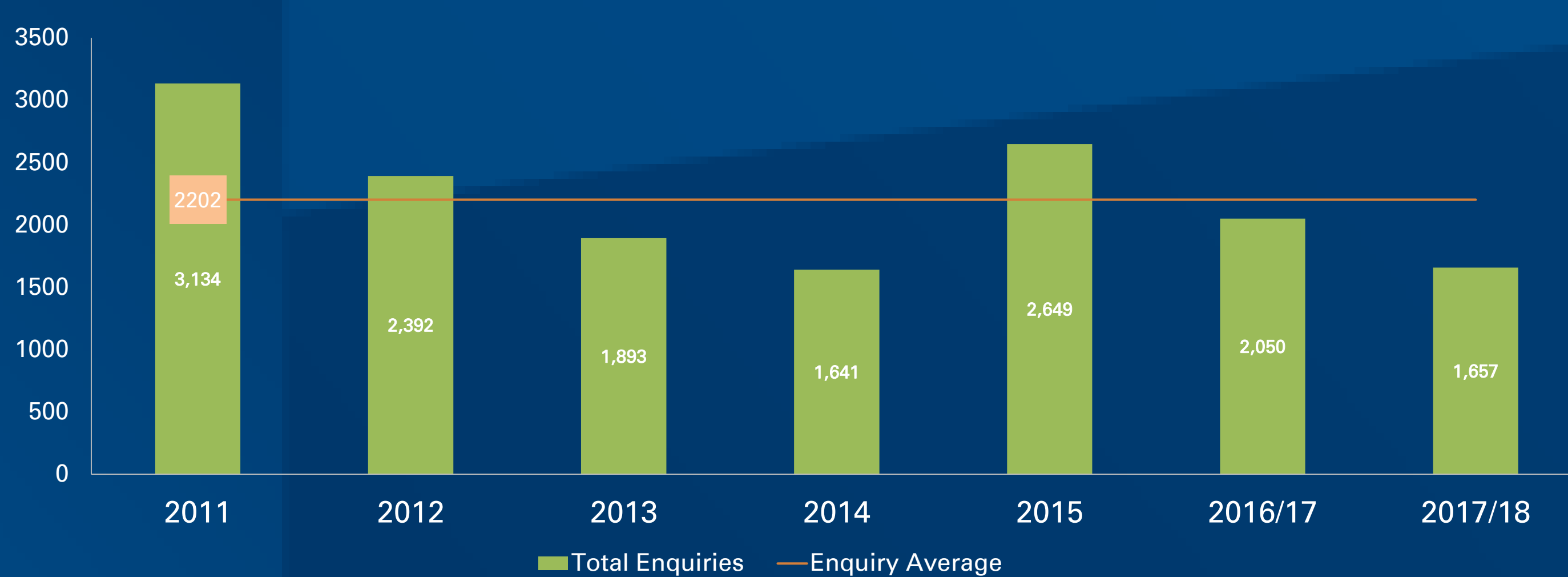
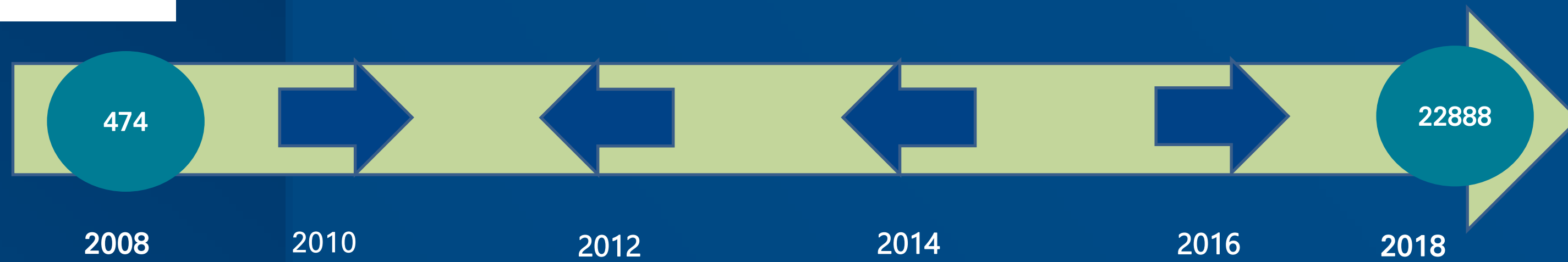
Usage

Users

92% of research output users are external users (universities, government, donor organisations, research institutions, NGOs and private) and 8% are HSRC employees. 90% of users are South African and 10% are from other countries, mainly the USA and UK.



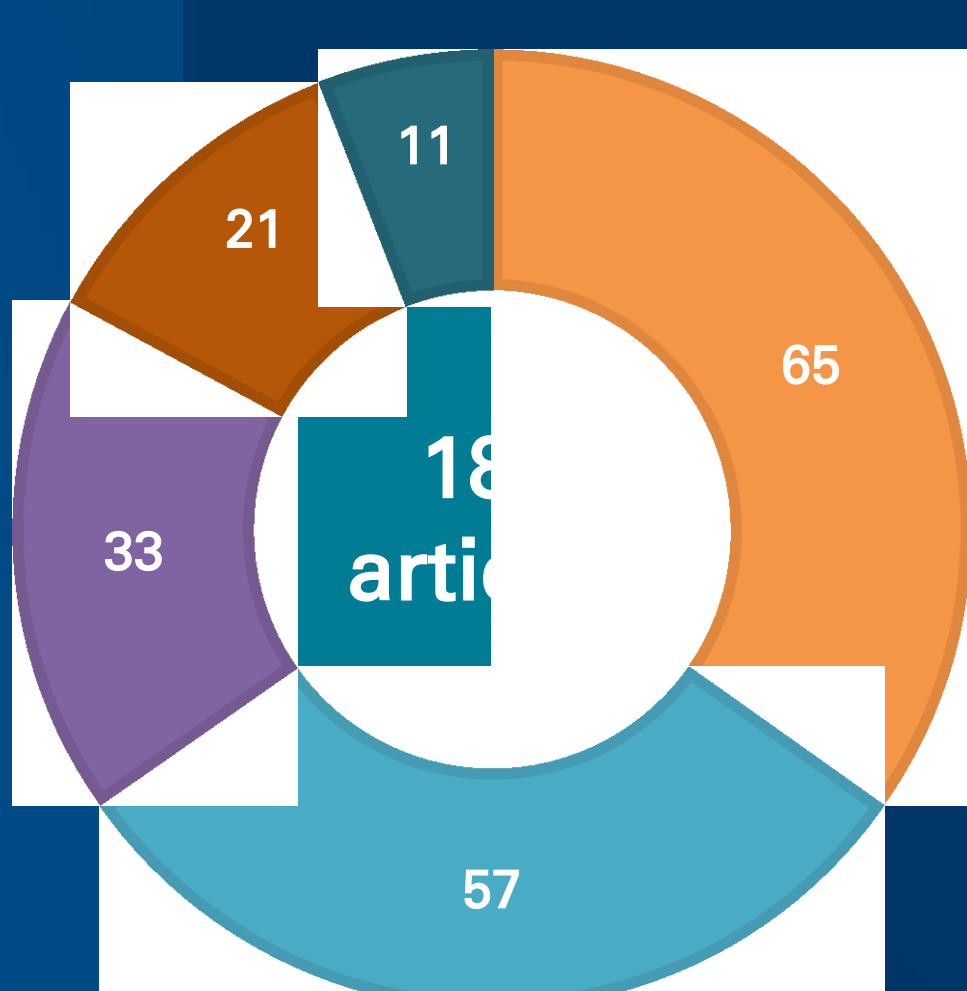
Number of research outputs delivered

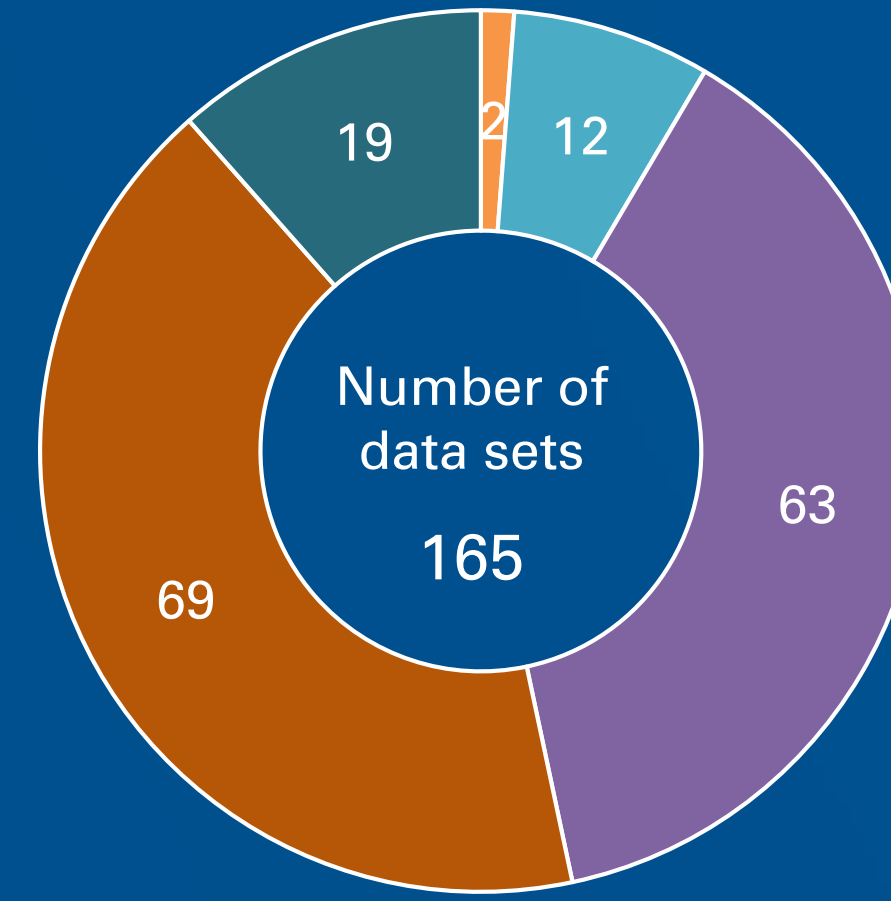
Target exceeded by 3000%

Users

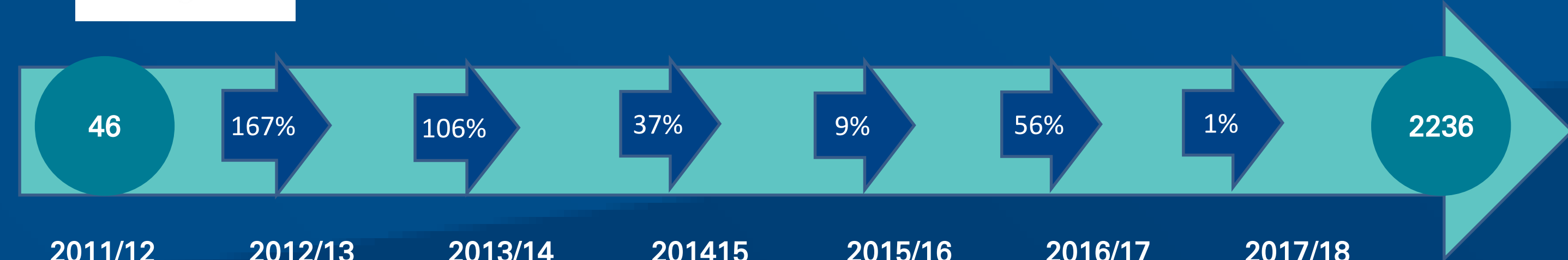
46% of data users are external and 7% are HSRC employees. 47% of users do not specify their affiliation or country of origin. Of the external users who provide such information, 34% are non-South African (mostly from the USA) and 12% are from other South African organisations.



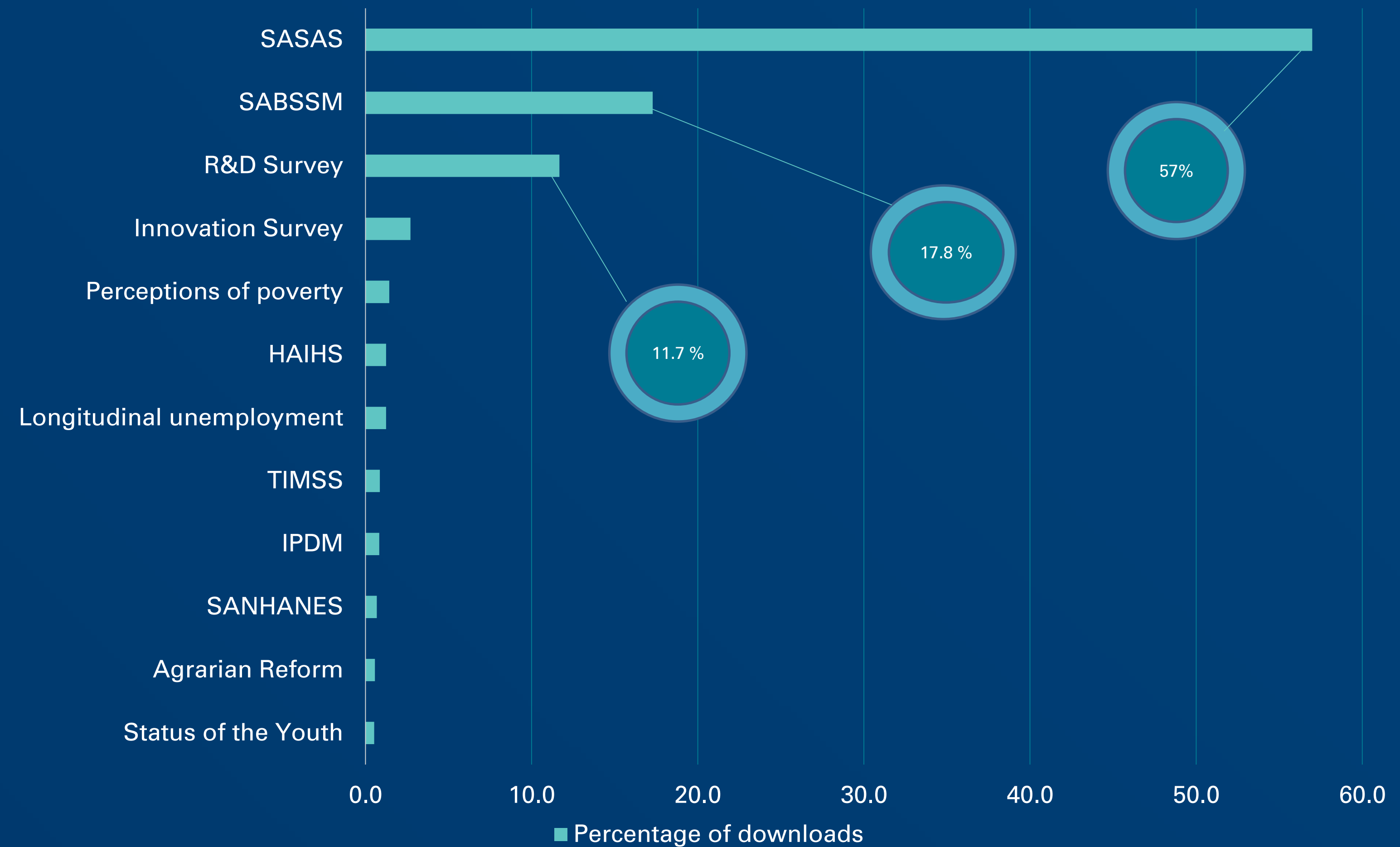
Intended use
