




Background & Policy Context

- Rural development is a strategic priority of the 2009-2014 administration; articulated in Outcome 7 & Plan of Action
- Infrastructure backlogs and low levels of human development indicators in 22 + 2 Rural District Municipalities
- Interventions = public investment, institutional coordination, community social interactions, etc
- Lead Department = Rural Development and Land Reform (DRDLR)
- DST active participant in rural innovation partnership anchored in RDMs- multi-disciplinary and interactive sectoral approaches
- Grounded in the Cabinet approved Action Plan 6: Scaling up rural-development programmes including investment in rural areas and smaller town revitalisation

What is RIAT?

- In 2012 HSRC contracted by DST to assist with broad-based development in the 24 RDM by:
 - Apply 'innovation systems thinking' to understand all factors and actors influencing new knowledge generation, diffusion and use for rural development
 - Facilitate interaction among innovation actors and partners- self-reflection & horizon exploration
 - Develop a "Rural Innovation Assessment Toolbox" (RIAT) to guide the 'Partnership'
 - Big Policy Spinoff: M&E tool for future interventions for local innovation - field-test RIAT in a few pilot sites



Critical engagement with 'theory'

- What are the existing conceptions of rural innovation and how useful are these concepts to capture rural realities?
- Where does 'rural innovation' fit into South Africa's post-1996 science, technology and innovation (ST&I) policy landscape?
- What are the strengths and weaknesses of existing methods to measure the extent and impacts of innovation activities in rural areas?




Our Contributions... New Ideas

- Innovation Value Chains: Adoption, adaption and diffusion are integral to almost every innovation value chain yet these are not often seen as 'proper' innovation activities.
- Sub-national Space-bounded innovation systems: discovering the creative potential and learning capabilities in rural areas
- Social Innovation: Direct participatory forms of local organisation of people to improve livelihoods through 'new' know-how...



RIAT concepts: Birds-eye view




RIAT: Toolbox with multiple instruments

Enterprise/Organisational Profiles

- What the enterprise does: Where, When, How & Why?
- Admin Database: Name, Contact Details, Locality & Main Activity
- Enterprise Type: Private/Public/NPO...
- Ownership: size (private=1 or more owners), legal entity (company...cooperative), tax registration
- Economic Sector: Farm & Non-Farm (broad SIC)

Internal Organisational Environment

- Main place- facilities, resources & services
- Own private investment
- Skills & capabilities participation in skills development programmes & impacts on innovation activities?
- Resource & Service Details:
 - Energy
 - ICT (cell phones & internet)
 - Transportation




Macro/External Environment & Self-learning

- Use of Private & Public Services (broad categories)
 - Information flow on innovation- sources of new ideas, etc. ... & adoption/use
 - Institutional environment- cooperation among actors; formal/informal; effectiveness
 - Policy environment & interactions with government departments
- Environmental Sustainability & Broader Societal Impact
- Direct self-evaluation: exposure to new ideas about innovation through participation?



Survey Approach & Framework

- Rural reality- below the surface 'innovation activities'; hard to find actors (organisations/enterprises)
- Non-probability sampling usually based on convenience= PURPOSE
- Select participating enterprises through a referral process= 'snowball sampling'


