









Daily cigarette use among adolescents






Environmental tobacco smoke among adolescents in percent






Daily smoking among adolescents by race






Daily smoking among adults by sex







Current alcohol use among adolescents in percent










pregnancy status by province, 2005 SABSSAM II Hazardous or harmful drinking in total population and




