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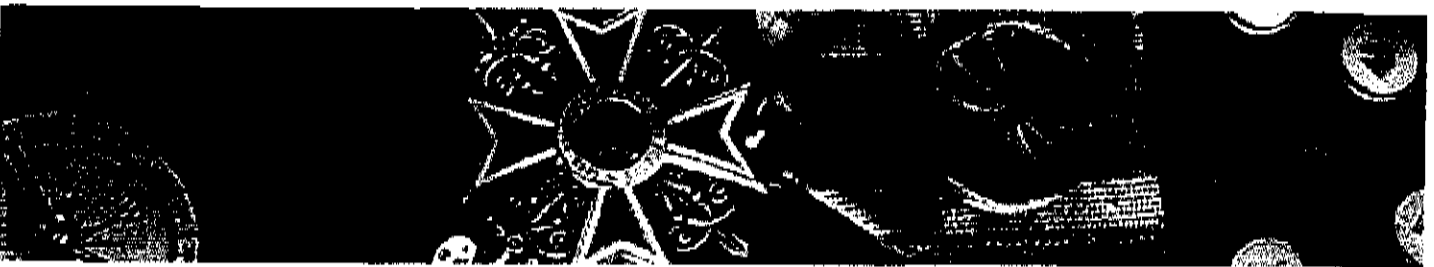

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# Aim

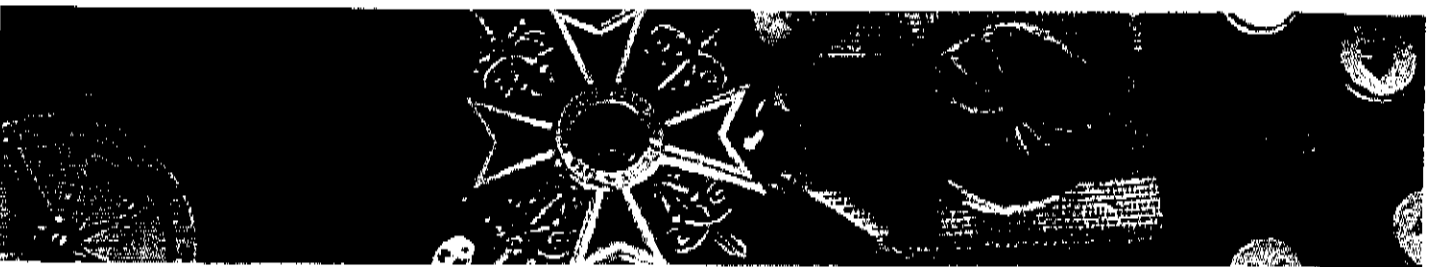
- **Ascertain the extent to which:**
  - ◆ Various initiatives brought about economic equity in Mbombela.
  - ◆ Service delivery, esp. in areas where huge backlogs exist, were sped up &
  - ◆ Issues impacting on service delivery.
  - ◆ The role of the Mbombela Local Municipality in bringing initiatives to fruition.





# Background

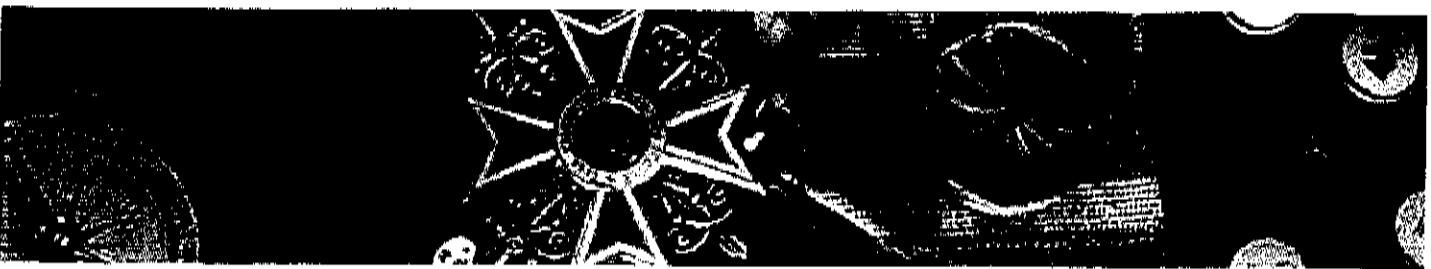
- Mainly white core that is
  - ◆ developed, well serviced, employment, econ opportunities, literacy &
- Black dominated peri-urban areas where
  - ◆ service delivery and econ opportunities non-existed/limited, unemployment & illiteracy.





# Methodology

- ◆ Face-face interviews with various government officials
- ◆ Follow up interviews either telephonically or via email
- ◆ Initial difficulty in secure interviews
- ◆ Face-face interviews with NGOs and local community leader
- ◆ 12 citizens interviews – 6 rural & urban each

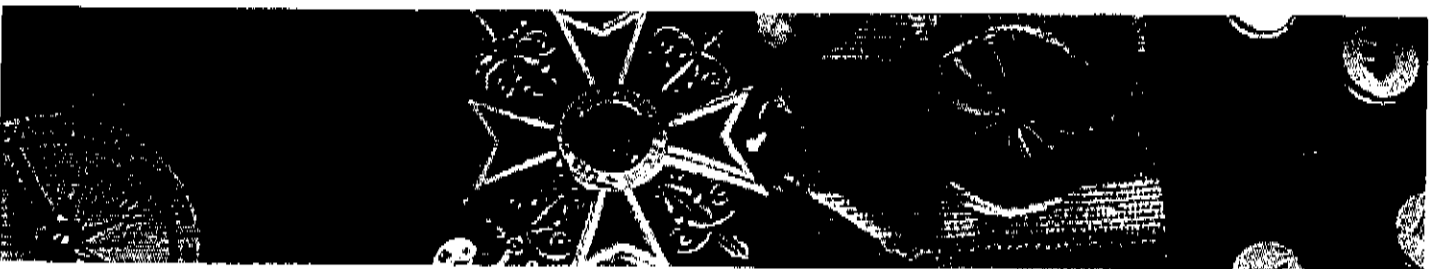




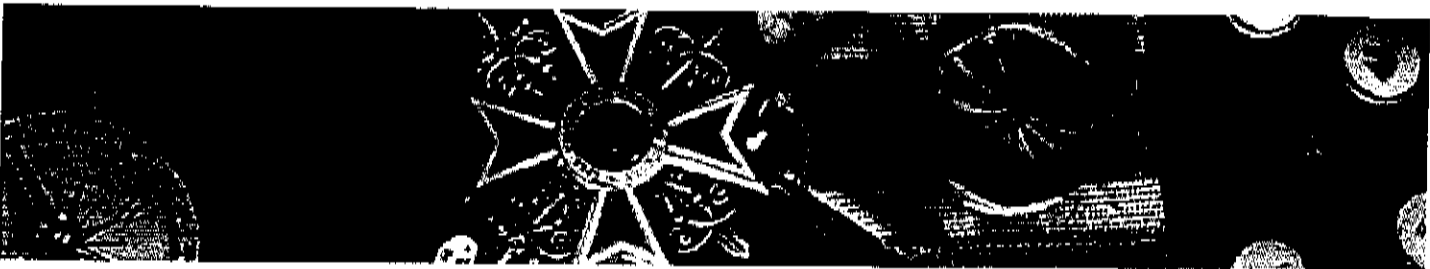
# Outputs

- ◆ kaNyamazane URP
- ◆ LED initiatives
- ◆ LRAD
- ◆ Service delivery
  - ◆ - e.g. Water, electricity & housing







# Objective

## ● **Ultimate objective:**

- ◆ Ensure economic expansion
- ◆ Increase development & economic opportunities in townships & rural areas
- ◆ LED initiatives
- ◆ Increase Black business
- ◆ Bring Black business into mainstream economy





# Objectives

## ● Maputo Development Corridor SDI

- ◆ to attract Foreign Direct Investment (FDI)
- ◆ to unearth and unlock local economic potential of the landlocked parts of the country and generate sustainable economic growth
- ◆ to promote regional economic cooperation
- ◆ to create sustainable jobs
- ◆ to exploit spin-off opportunities that ooze out of the crowding in of FDI



# Outputs

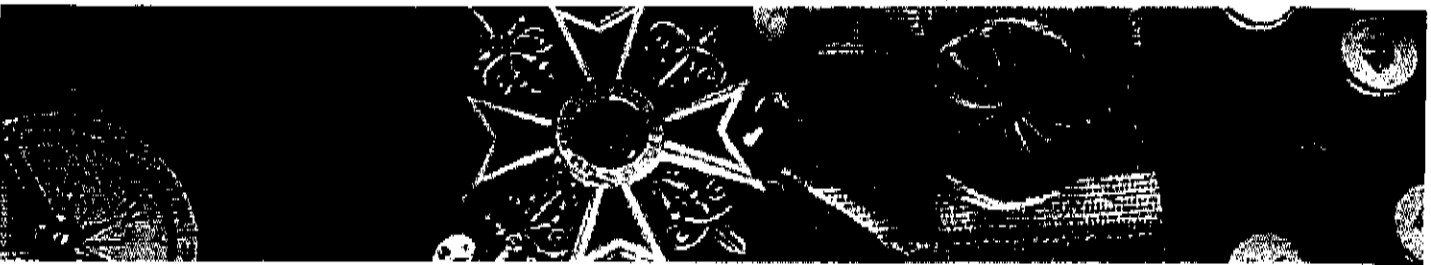
- ◆ **Maputo Development Corridor SDI**
- ◆ The building of the R350 m KMIA
- ◆ Construction of the N4
- ◆ Redevelopment of the Maputo port
- ◆ Increase of export through port & airport
- ◆ Tourism promotion initiatives





# Impacts

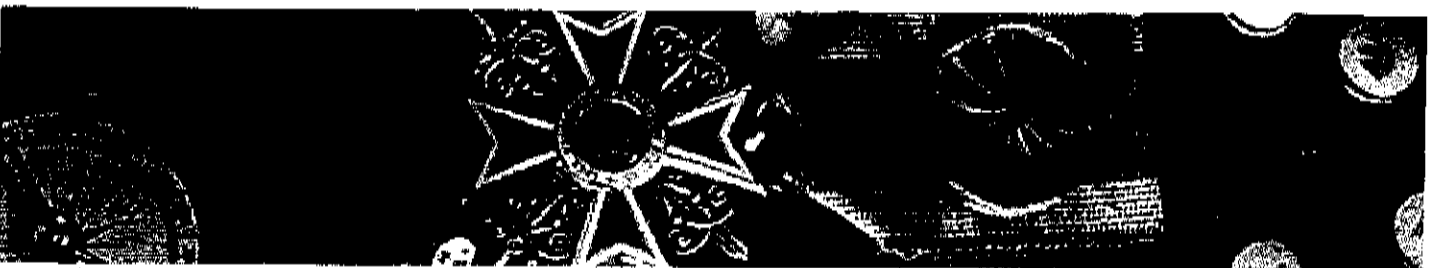
- ◆ Local residents gained employment at various construction jobs
- ◆ Increase in the no of Black entrepreneurs in the tourism industry
- ◆ Mbuyane community as part owners of KMIA benefited considerably
- ◆ *However*: established white business took the lion share of the economic benefits





# Outputs

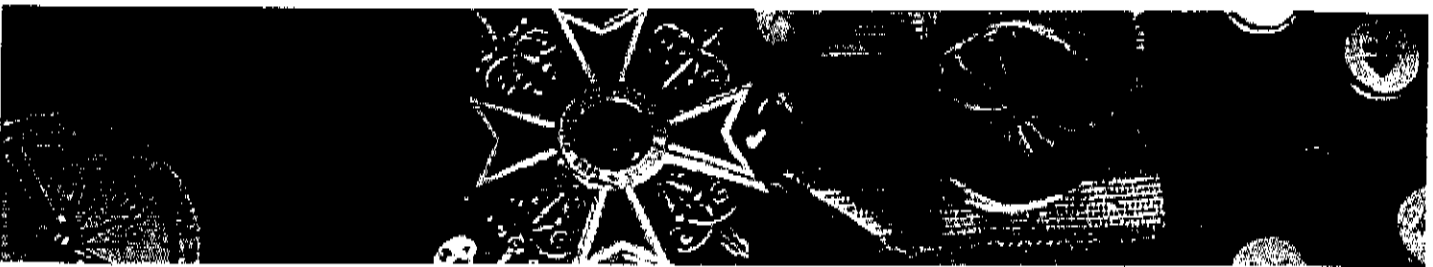
- **Successful LED initiatives include:**
  - ◆ The Shabalala Multipurpose Centre
  - ◆ The Daantjie Community Bakery Project





# Impacts

- ◆ Emergence of sustainable community based businesses
- ◆ Job creation
- ◆ Short & long term employment
- ◆ *However:* various problems were encountered and quotas were not reached,







# LRAAD

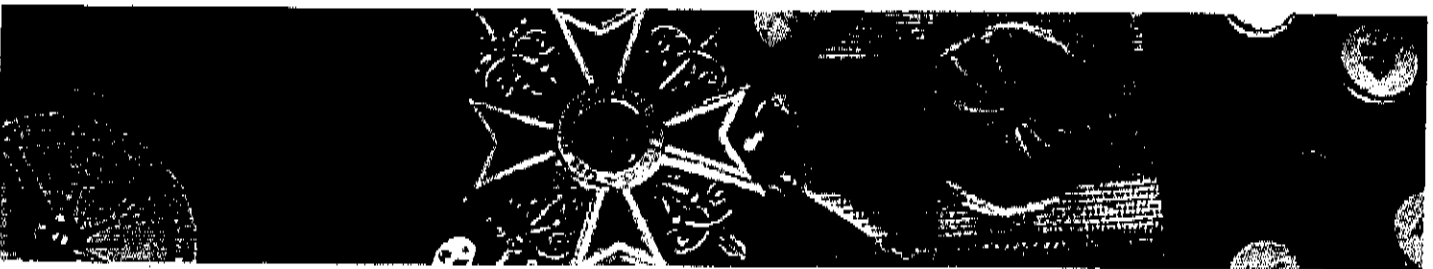
- ◆ Agriculture is an important part of Mbombela economy
- **Objectives**
  - ◆ Increase economic contribution of agricultural sector by 20% over the next 5 years
  - ◆ Promote Black farmers into mainstream agricultural economy
- **Output**
  - ◆ 240 farmers, each with 7 hectares of land.



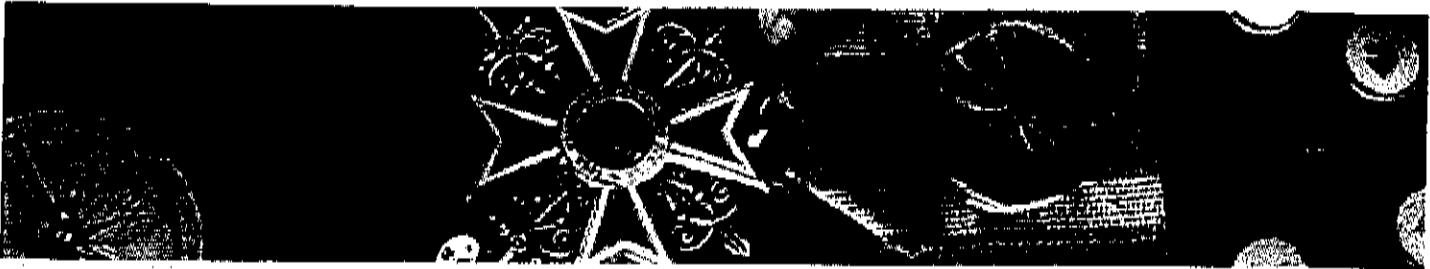
# Housing

## • **Social Housing**

- ◆ Tekwane South – 1000 houses
- ◆ Peoples' Housing Process (PHP) – 8 projects in rural and urban areas, e.g. the Vukuzimele trust







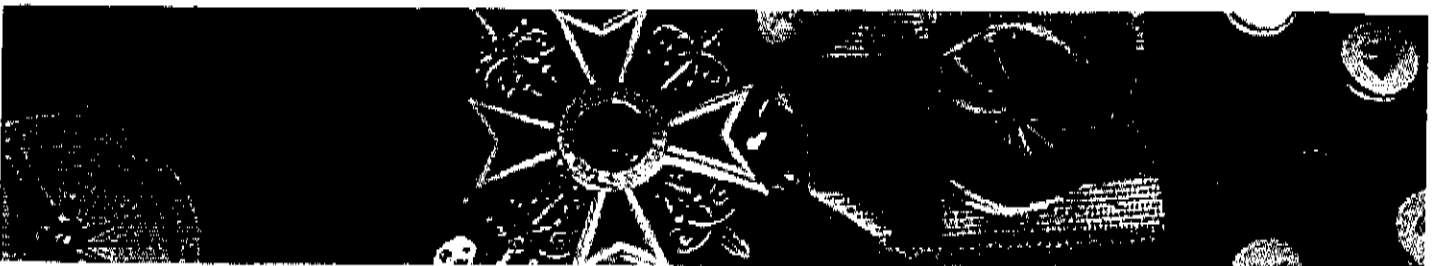
# Water

- ◆ Greatest challenge is to address past backlogs in water services
- ◆ **Outputs:** free basic water supply
- ◆ **Impact:** water service delivery fast tracked e.g. metered connection in the yard or communal standpipe.
- ◆ ***However:*** culture of non payment ensue and illegal connections abound.



# Electricity

- ◆ Local municipality committed to maintaining existing electricity networks
- ◆ Agreement with Eskom to supply electricity to townships.
- ◆ **Output:** Kisko corporation supplied electricity
- ◆ *However:* low or non payment for electricity, hence illegal connections abound.







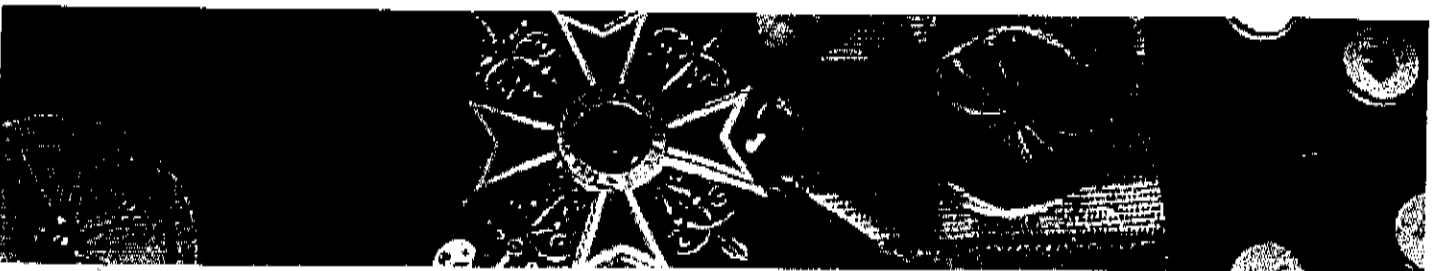
# Factors hampering service delivery

- ◆ Culture of non-payment & tenure insecurities hampered effective service delivery
- ◆ Income generated from services used to maintain existing services
- ◆ Tenure insecurities need to be addressed & resolved

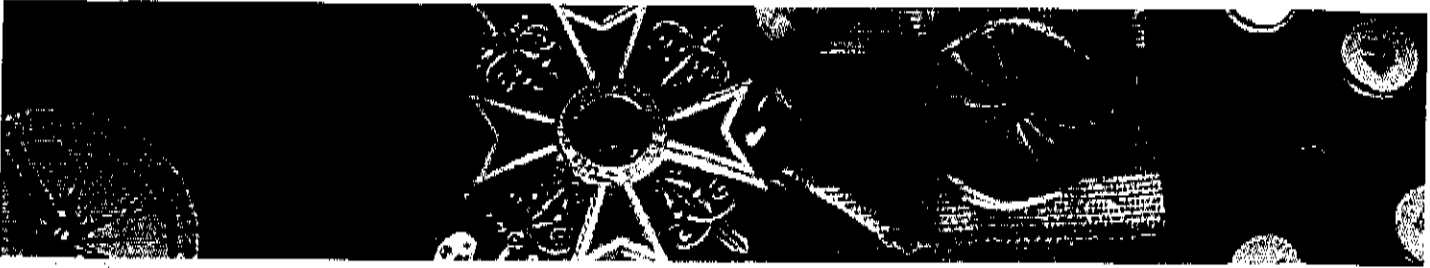


## Tenure issues

- ◆ Tenure issues should be resolved in order to adequately address the service backlog and upgrade infrastructure or provide new infrastructure.



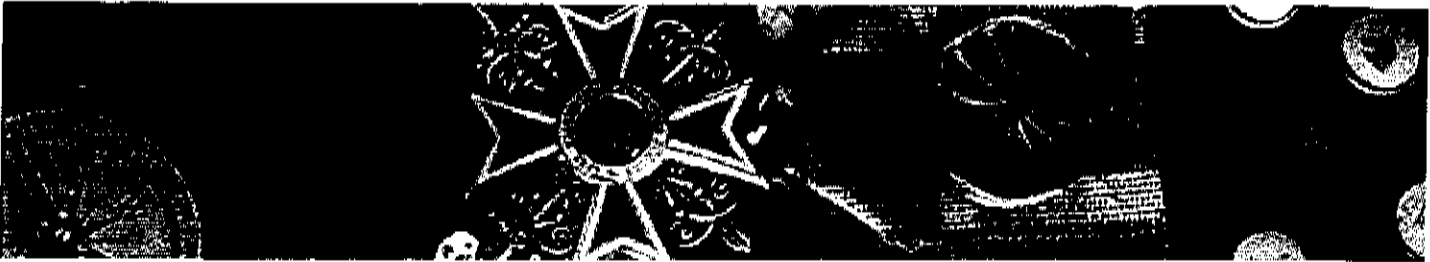




# Formalisation of townships & tenure insecurities

- ◆ Building bylaws were not enforced
- ◆ Wide spread encroachment abound
- ◆ Informal housing occurs
- ◆ Permanent structures build on land deemed unsuitable for habitation
- ◆ Tenure insecurities abound in many towns





# Formalising of townships & tenure security

- ◆ Township registers in 20 townships
- ◆ Formalisation of 11813 stands
- ◆ Pilot programme – combat illegal squatting
- ◆ **The tenure process**
- ◆ **Objective:** ensure that all residents have formalised land tenure by 2020.
- ◆ **Output:** 2192 deeds of grants and they now have full ownership of the land they reside on.



# Conclusion

- ◆ Mbombela economy was boosted
- ◆ Black empowerment and SMME opportunities were created.
- ◆ Some mainstreaming of Black business
- ◆ Job creation
- ◆ Service provision occurred
- ◆ Townships have been formalised and tenure process is continuing.
