The attached report shows progress made on a quarterly basis accumulating to an annual basis. By 30 September 2012, the HSRC achieved 87.5% performance against ADEPTS indicators now due for reporting and can be summarised as follows:

A-Advance 60% (Achieved 6 out of 10 with one annual target already exceeded)

D-Develop 100% (Achieved 1 out of 1)

E-Enhance 100% (Achieved 3 out of 3 with one annual target already exceeded) **P**-Preserve 112.5% (Preserved 9 datasets exceeding our quarterly target of 8)

T-Transform 100% (Achieved 3 out of 3)

S-Sustain 75% (Achieved 3 out of 4 with two annual targets already exceeded)

The HSRC continuously monitors progress with the implementation of deliverables agreed upon in its annual performance plan and actual outputs are validated by different management structures. The 2012/13 quarterly performance reports against strategic objectives will be reviewed by the HSRC Board at its meeting in November 2012.

Other reporting requirements listed in the Shareholder's Compact are also receiving the necessary attention from the HSRC.
