## Key issues to be discussed?

The Forum will discuss **inequality at a sectoral level, including inequalities in health, education, agriculture, mining, energy, water resources, trade, finance, taxation, employment, labour markets, and media** amongst others.

The role of government policies and multinational companies in promoting inequality will also be discussed.

Disparities in policies on and access to resources are at the heart of societal discontent, leading to the formation of mass movements disenchanted with politicians and demanding change and a growing trend towards concomitant protest action.

Besides focusing on the challenges posed by inequality, the Forum will consider social policy and programmatic options for countries, regions and the global community to deploy in reducing inequality and bringing about an egalitarian society

The Forum programme will include plenary presentations by **world-renowned speakers, alongside presentations from scientists, civil society and business**. It will allow for scientific discussions, policy debates, symposia, and workshops on any of the areas that fall under the theme of social justice.
